Nine years ago, Giulia Gasparro upon her election as the president of the EASR in 2000 at the inaugural meeting in Krakow, proposed to organize a small conference in Messina the same year. Being in Messina today turns out to be a sort of coming back to one of the foundational moment and places of the EASR. Of course, this time it is a full conference with more than 200 participants. The number of participants shows in itself, how important our meetings have grown over this short period of nine years. We would like to thank Giulia Gasparro and her team for the exceptional organization and the hosting of the conference. We have enjoyed a wonderful hospitality.

The great number of participants shows also that our organization has become an important opportunity for exchange: scholars meet to discuss methods and inquiries and share their research. Many thanks to the other officers: Mar Marcos (Membership Officer), Katja Triplett (Internet Officer), Eugen Ciurtin (Publication Officer), as well as to the other members of the committee who have contributed by sharing with us their opinions, work time and scholarship.

The committee members have been in contact with each other throughout the year and the various tasks and the decisions taken are the outcome of a joint effort.

During the month of April I was commissioned to undertake the site visit for this year's conference in Messina and what I saw and heard convinced me that the organization was in good hands indeed.

Regarding the many points discussed during this year, let me point out the wish to improve our website, which will be realized in the coming months. We are also working at improving our election system to guarantee a democratic system and a pragmatically smooth procedure.
